TERMS OF THE INSPECTION:

SERVICEABLE: It is the inspectors opinion that this item is doing the job for which it was intended and exhibits normal wear and tear.

NEEDS ATTENTION: It is the inspectors opinion that this item is in need of further investigation and/or repairs or appears to be at the end of its service life. The inspector has made the client aware of this situation by calling it "needs attention" in the report and it is then the clients responsibility to take appropriate action concerning the situation with the appropriate professional during the inspection contingency period and prior to the close of escrow.

NOT ACCEPTABLE: It is the inspectors opinion that this item is either a safety hazard or not functioning properly, The inspector has made the client aware of this situation by calling it "not acceptable" and it is then the clients responsibility to take appropriate action concerning the situation with the appropriate professional during the inspection contingency period and prior to the close of escrow.

STANDARDS OF PRACTICE:

- A. The report conforms to the Standards and Practices of the American Society of Home Inspectors (ASHI) and the Business and Professions Code which defines a real estate inspection as a survey and basic operation of the systems and components of a building which can be reached, entered, or viewed without difficulty, moving obstructions, or requiring any action which may result in damage to the property or personal injury to the inspector. The purpose of the inspection is to provide the Client with information regarding the general condition of the building(s). Cosmetic and aesthetic conditions shall not be considered.
- B. A real estate inspection report provides written documentation of material defects discovered in the inspected building's systems and components which, in the opinion of the Inspector, are safety hazards, are not functioning properly, or appear to be at the ends of their service life. The report may include the Inspector's recommendations for correction or further evaluation.
- C. Inspections performed in accordance with these Standards of Practice are not technically exhaustive and shall apply to the primary building and its associated primary parking structure.

INTRODUCTORY COMMENTS

GENERAL NOTES

The building has had some work done to it recently including new painting, flooring etc. It is not known what the condition of the property was before this work was undertaken. Many of these new items may not have been tested under actual living conditions or undergone weather testing.

It appears that there have been alterations and upgrades to the property over the years. Modifications to the electrical, plumbing and mechanical systems as well as to the structure of the building require permits and progress inspections. It is advised to obtain any and all documentation that might possibly be available. This should be done prior to the expiration of the contingency period.

It is typical when a building is remodeled or repairs are undertaken that additional problems surface that were not noted on the inspection report. This is to be expected as walls, floors and ceilings are opened up during the work to reveal areas that were not accessible during the inspection. Any remodeling work undertaken on a property should be expected to reveal some of these problems and it is recommended that additional sums be set aside for this purpose.

This building inspection is for the current owner/caretaker/occupant. Our goal is to evaluate the major systems of the building and the general conditions so that you will better understand it's present actual condition. This information may direct you to needed repairs and maintenance, or let you know what a perspective buyer will look at and may consider less than optimum. Some of the wording in the report may be from the perspective of what a new buyer would want to know, and may suggest additional specialist evaluation. These additional specialists may be desirable to fully evaluate some areas, and to provide price estimates. We appreciate your understanding if some of the language or phrasing is not appropriate for your specific situation. We will be happy to help clarify any confusions.

PLUMBING SYSTEM

While some plumbing observation may be code related, this inspection does not determine if the system complies with code. Supply and waste lines are inspected only where they are accessible and while operating accessible fixtures and drains. Performance of the water flow can vary during different times of the day and performance of the drain during actual usage is undetermined. Drain blockage is common in vacant property. It is advised to have any underground drain/sewer lines examined by a specialist with a camera to determine their actual condition. The following are not included; inaccessible supply or waste lines, leaks in inaccessible areas such as walls, underground or the crawl space, the interior of pipes for mineral or corrosive clogging, water hammering, solar equipment or water temperature, and the condition of shower pans or if a shower will leak when used. No water testing of any type is performed. The type of copper, whether it is M, L, or K, is not part of this inspection and will not be determined. The gas system is not tested for leaks and any underground or hidden gas lines are specifically excluded from this report. Determining the operation of sewer ejection systems is excluded from this inspection and it should be examined by a specialist. The angle stops under sinks and other plumbing valves, such as the main shut off valve, are not turned or tested. The finish fixtures as toilets, sinks and faucets etc are covered in the Kitchen and Bathroom section of this report.

MAIN WATER SUPPLY LINE

MAIN WATER LINE MATERIAL

Copper piping is viewed coming out of the ground by the building and as the main line runs underground from the street to the building, this appears to be the main water line. As the underground portion is not seen, no assumption is made as to its condition or material.

MAIN WATER SHUT OFF LOCATION

In the front of the building



CONDITION

Serviceable.

WATER SUPPLY PRESSURE REGULATOR

REG CONDITION

Needs Attention: No pressure regulator was observed at the main line line where it enters the structure. Sometimes they are installed in other areas and it is advised to check with a professional to determine if there is one on the system or not.

WATER PRESSURE

The water flow appears serviceable at the fixtures when operated during this brief inspection.

PRESSURE RELIEF VALVE

Needs Attention: A pressure relief valve was not located for the main water line it is recommended one be installed to reduce the risk of pipe failure and flooding.

INTERIOR WATER SUPPLY LINES

WATER SUPPLY PIPING MATERIAL

The interior piping that supplies the water throughout the building is made of copper where visible.

CONDITION

Serviceable, where visible.

WATER SUPPLY PIPING COMMENTS

Needs Attention: There are pressurized plastic sprinkler pipes passing under the house. This material is not approved for use here due to the risk of leaks and flooding. These should be relocated to outside the foundation, or replaced with approved piping as with copper.



WASTE LINES

WASTE LINE MATERIAL

The piping that takes the waste water to the sewer system is a combination of different materials where visible

CONDITION

Needs Attention:

There are both areas of newer plastic and older cast iron. There are rusty areas on the exterior of the waste lines for some of the left over older cast iron under the building. It is not possible to tell when but they will need replacing in the future as they continue to wear out.





GAS SYSTEM

SEISMIC GAS SHUT OFF VALVE

There is an automatic seismic gas shut-off valve installed on the main gas line

GAS METER LOCATION

The gas meter was located on the left side of the building





CONDITION Needs Attention:

There are no or improper gas line sediment traps installed in areas such as at the attic heater as required by today's standards.



There are areas with hard piped, gas lines, and no flexible sections of gas piping. Flexible sections of piping are recommended to allow for movement in the case of an earthquake at the water heater.



COMMENTS

It is advised to have the gas provider inspect the gas system to determine its condition and check all the gas appliances and fixtures. This is usually a free service.

WATER HEATER

LOCATION

The water heater is located in the laundry.



LOCATION CONDITION

Needs Attention: the condensate drain line is too short and so it's not against the wall.



There does not appear to be the required bonding connection between the water pipes and the gas pipe.





FUEL

Gas

SIZE

This is a tankless on-demand type water heater. It does not store and continually heat water, but instead provides it as needed by the occupants. NOTE, these typically require the internal tank system be 'flushed' or de mineralized to remove 'lime' build-up. Typically these should be cleaned every 6 months. Check with the plumber or manufacturer for details.

AGE

2-3 years old. Tankless water heaters have an expected life of 15 - 20 years.



CONDITION

Serviceable.

COMBUSTION AIR

Serviceable.

WATER HEATER STRAPPING AND SUPPORT

Straps are not required for this type tankless water heater.

TEMPERATURE/PRESSURE RELIEF VALVE

Needs Attention:

The temperature/pressure relief valve has no drain line installed to take the water away to a safe location if the valve releases. We recommend this drain line be installed in case this valve ever released.



VENTING

Needs Attention: the roof vent is missing a rain cap or turn down / bend to prevent rain entering and has gaps at the PVC vent and metal vent area.







COMMENTS

Note: The water heater is a tankless on-demand water heater. It operated when the hot water faucets were turned on and supplied hot water. It is not known how well it will function when multiple fixtures are operated or if it is sized properly for the amount of fixtures it has to service. It is advised to check with the current owner to determine its workability under actual use conditions.

The adequacy or efficiency of the hot water heater cannot be determined in a limited time visual inspection. It is not known how hot the water will get or how long it will last and this is many times a matter of personal preference.

PLUMBING COMMENTS

SCOPE SEWER COMMENTS

The sewer lines that go out to the sewer system are installed underground and are not visible. Their condition is unknown. The only way to determine what is going on with them is to have them checked out with a camera by a specialist to determine their true condition and any needed repairs. NOTE: there is a distinction between 'waste lines' and 'sewer lines' - while both take the drain / waste water away from sinks and toilets and out of the structure, the 'waste line' is under the structure, sometimes visible and sometimes not, and the 'sewer lines' start 2 feet outside the house and extends to the city sewer. A typical 'sewer line inspection' is only the portion outside the structure to the city sewer, and not under the structure. Some plumbers can also inspect the 'waste / drain' lines actually under the structure, using a smaller video camera system. This is a separate specialty inspection.

IMPORTANT! a recent change in LA building code requires that any structure built before 1965 that is undergoing plumbing repair or building remodeling with permits is required to have a video inspection of the sewer line between the house and the public sewer main to check for the presence of concrete sewer pipe, and if found, this may need to be repaired or replaced.

ELECTRICAL SYSTEM

Electrical features are operated with normal controls. The general wiring, switches, outlets and fixtures are randomly checked in accessible areas. Wiring in the main box is inspected by removing the cover if accessible. While some observations may be code related, this inspection does not determine if the system complies with code. The inspection does not determine electrical capacity, determine over current capacity for any item including appliances, compare circuit breaker capacity to installed appliance rating. Also excluded are interior or exterior low voltage wiring or fixtures, telephone, security, intercom, stereo, cable or satellite TV, remote controls or timers. The exterior lighting, landscape lighting or any lighting outside the footprint of the building is not inspected. Light bulbs are not removed or changed during an inspection. This inspection does not certify or warrant the system to be free of risk of fire, electrocution or personal injury or death.

MAIN ELECTRICAL SERVICE

TYPE OF ELECTRICAL SERVICE

The electricity is supplied by an overhead line from the power pole, 120/240 Volts

BUILDING ELECTRICAL SERVICE

Needs Attention:

The main electrical line from the power pole to the building has some contact from tree branches and limbs and they may need to be trimmed back at times to keep them from putting pressure on the line.





MAIN PANEL LOCATION

The main electrical panel is located on the left exterior of the building.

MAIN PANEL AMPERAGE

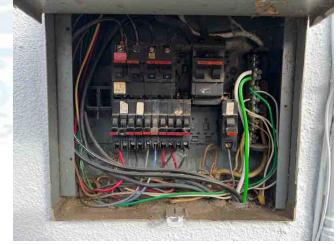
The main electrical panel is on circuit breakers

MAIN PANEL CONDITION

Not Acceptable:

This panel and circuit breaker system is an old "Stab-Lok" or "FPE" (Federal Pacific Electric) system. It is past the end of its expected life span. As with all older systems it will be more prone to failure due to its age and design. Some of these older systems have a reputation for unreliability, failing to trip, jamming, or overheating. Electricians may recommend the panel be replaced for safety.





GROUNDING SYSTEM

The connection of the grounding wires to the grounding system is not visible. It should be connected to a grounding rod and/or the cold water piping system but in many cases these connections are not observable and are covered over within the building.

ELECTRICAL SUBPANELS

SUBPANEL LOCATION

There is an electrical subpanel in the garage





SUBPANEL CONDITION

Needs Attention: one of the cover screws is missing.

The circuit breakers in the panel(s) do not have a complete directory so it is not known what each

breaker controls (or protects) in the building.





INTERIOR ELECTRICAL WIRING

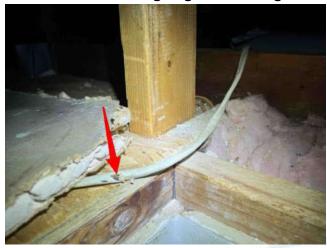
The wiring consists of plastic insulated wires where visible.

TYPE OF WIRING CONDUIT

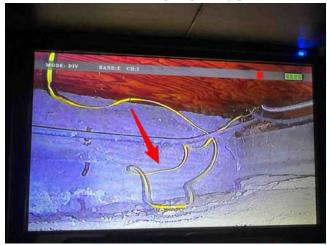
The conduit that carries the wiring is a combination of different types

WIRING CONDITION

Needs Attention: the garage attic wiring is damaged at the attic access



There are areas of dangling wiring that are not properly secured to the framing under the house.



OUTLETS

CONDITION

Needs Attention:

There are some electrical plugs that having missing or damaged covers such as at the powder bathroom.

GFCI OUTLETS

Needs Attention:

There are some areas that do not appear to have the required GFCI safety devices (Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter) such as at the laundry and garage.

Note: These are required in specific areas near water such as in the bathrooms, kitchens, laundry, garage and exterior outlets.

FIXTURES

CONDITION

Needs Attention:

There are light fixtures that did not work. This can be a burnt out bulb but it is not known exactly why they are not working such as at the dining area and garage attic.





SWITCHES

CONDITION

Needs Attention: the attic switch cover plate is damaged.





SMOKE ALARMS

CONDITION

Smoke alarms are installed in the correct locations but they are not tested as part of this inspection.

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR

There was a carbon monoxide detector located. This device may be required. If further information is needed check with a retrofitting specialist, this is usually done as part of the transaction process.

ELECTRICAL COMMENTS

NOTES

The wiring that is enclosed within the walls and ceilings and other parts of the structure is not visible and its condition cannot be fully determined. No representation is made as to its status.



HEATING & COOLING SYSTEM

While some observations may be code related, this inspection does not determine if the system complies with code. Weather permitting the systems are operated with normal controls. In order not to damage the system, the air conditioners are not activated if the outdoor temperature is below 65 degrees. Gas furnaces are not checked for carbon monoxide leakage or fire risks. There are carbon monoxide and fire detection devices which can be purchased and installed, which we recommend. Air ducts and registers are randomly checked for air flow. Heat exchangers are specifically excluded from the inspection. They are visually obstructed by the design of the system and a complete inspection requires special tools and disassembly, which is beyond the scope of the inspection. The following items are beyond the scope of the inspection; balance of the air flow, capacity or velocity of the air flow, humidifiers, air duct cleanliness, the ability of the system to heat or cool evenly, the presence of toxic or hazardous material or asbestos, system refrigerant levels, cooling or heating capacity to determine if its sufficient for the building, electronic air filters, solar equipment, programmable thermostats and determining the remaining life of the system. Window A/C's are not built in units and therefore not inspected.

The heating unit is in the attic.

The furnace is a gas-fired forced air system.

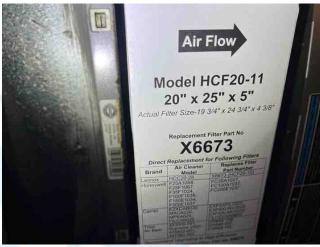

RETURN AIR AND FILTERS

Needs Attention:

The air filters are dirty at the attic heater and need to be replaced, They should be changed every 3-6 months depending on use.





DUCTING AND AIR FLOW

Serviceable, where visible.

GENERAL COMMENTS

From 2010. It is advised to keep the unit serviced and cleaned on a periodic basis to ensure a safe and properly functioning system. It is beyond the scope of the inspection to inspect the inner working of the furnace including the firebox. This can and should be done by a licensed heating contractor at this time.

The condenser for the air conditioning is located in the rear yard

The air conditioning is a split system type, this is where the furnace(forced air unit) is inside the building and the air conditioner condenser is outside the structure

HEATING AND COOLING COMMENTS

COMMENTS

Per the California Energy Commission, "Beginning October 1, 2005, Title 24 of the Building Energy Efficiency Standards requires that ducts be tested for leaks when a central air conditioner or furnace is installed or replaced. Ducts that leak 15% or more must be repaired" A property inspection will not be able to determine if air loss (leaky ducts etc) exceeds the maximum allowed of 15%. This test can only be done by a qualified technician and is beyond he scope of this inspection. It is advised to consult with a qualified specialist on this matter as the examination may determine that repairs or replacement of the ducting system is required.

The ducting that is hidden from view inside walls and ceilings, in hard to access portions of the attic is not visible and its condition and material is unknown. Additionally abandoned ducting is not inspected or commented on as a part of this inspection.

The roof is a sloped type with a pitch to it

The roof was walked on to inspect it.

The roof appeared generally serviceable.

EXPOSED FLASHINGS

CONDITION

Needs Attention:

Some of the flashings are missing screens or have partial screens to prevent animals from entering into the area below them.





GUTTERS, DOWNSPOUTS & ROOF DRAINAGE

GUTTER CONDITION

Needs Attention:

There are areas where the gutter system is filled with debris and needs to be cleaned out. This includes all accumulated roof debris on the roof itself.



All of the house and portions of the garage building have no guttering system to take the roof water properly off the structure.

ROOF COMMENTS

ROOF COMMENTS

It is important for all roofs to have regular maintenance, including cleaning out the gutters and drainlines and ensuring all the penetrations are properly sealed

The roof has been inspected at a time when it was not raining. Since one of the purposes of the roof is to repel water this could not be observed and verified as occurring in all cases. Therefore the roof has not been tested under wet conditions and how it performs in these condition is unknown. No warranty is made that it will not leak when it is under a wet condition.

EXTERIOR

The exterior is viewed in a cursory fashion. Areas of the exterior that are hidden from view by vegetation or stored items cannot be judged and are not a part of this inspection. Minor cracks are typical in many exterior wall coverings and most do not represent a structural problem. Peeling and cracking exterior paint on windows, doors and trim allow water to enter and cause damage and deterioration. It is important to keep these exterior surfaces properly painted and/or sealed. All exterior grades should allow for surface and roof water to flow away from the foundation and exterior walls. Chimney Inspection: This inspection is limited to those areas visible and readily accessible to the general inspector. Due for the potential for hidden damage within a chimney, it is advised to have any fireplace and chimney system fully examined by a qualified chimney specialist using a video camera to determine and report on the structural integrity and fire safety aspects of these systems.

EXTERIOR COVERING OF THE BUILDING

MATERIAL

The exterior building covering is stucco and wood siding

CONDITION

Serviceable.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

There is no weep screed installed as part of the stucco system. This is a piece of metal trim installed at the bottom of the stucco. Weep screeds were not required at the time this stucco was installed and so are not part of this system. As a result there may be times where the moisture behind the stucco does not drain properly or moisture wicks up into the stucco from the earth.

Areas of the garage exterior wall are against the property line or otherwise blocked and cannot be viewed, their condition is not verified.

The exterior window surfaces are vinyl

Needs Attention:

There are missing screens.

EXTERIOR DOOR SURFACES

MATERIAL

The exterior door surfaces are various types of material.

CONDITION

Serviceable.

SCREENS

Needs Attention: the doorbell button is loose.



EXTERIOR DOOR THRESHOLDS

CONDITION

Serviceable.

EXTERIOR TRIM

MATERIAL

The exterior trim surfaces are wood

CONDITION

Needs Attention:

The trim has areas of damage. At the back left corner of the garage and the back side trim.





GROUNDS

This inspection is not intended to address or include any geological conditions or site stability information. For information concerning these conditions, a geo-technical engineer should be consulted. Proper grading is important to keep water away from the foundation. If it is not raining during the inspection the course of water flowing toward the structure or off the site cannot be observed. The soil should slope away from the structure to prevent problems caused by excess water not flowing away properly. Gutter discharge should be directed away from the foundation for the same reason. Out buildings, such as storage sheds, on the property are excluded from the inspection. Fire pits, a B.B.Q. and other similar items are not inspected nor is the gas to them tested or lit. This inspection is visual in nature and does not attempt to determine drainage performance of the site or the condition of any underground piping, including municipal water and sewer service piping or septic systems. Landscape lighting, sprinklers and their timers are not part of a general property inspection. The inspection report does not include the identification of the property boundaries.

DRIVEWAY

CONDITION

There are cracked areas in the driveway that are typical for the age and style of construction.

Serviceable.

LANDSCAPING

CONDITION

The grounds on the property have generally been maintained

DRAINAGE

SITE

The site is a combination of flat and sloping areas

DRAINAGE CONDITION

There are planted areas next to the foundation, these are not recommended unless fully drained as they can allow moisture to oversaturate the soil and cause erosion and settlement over time. If severe enough this can also deteriorate the foundation walls over time.





It is unknown where the area drain at the back near the garage drains to.



COMMENTS

Determining the adequacy of the grounds to shed water and prevent moisture intrusion into the structure is beyond the scope of the inspection. It is advised to obtain the history of any drainage problems and monitor the site regarding water run-off and drainage in general. This inspection does not address drainage issues further than 6 feet from the building. Additionally drainage systems that are not visible such as underground systems are not evaluated or inspected. If more information is required it is advised to consult with a drainage specialist.

GROUNDS COMMENTS

GENERAL COMMENTS

This report does not include identification of property boundaries. A licensed surveyor would be the person to determine where they are.

GROUNDS COMMENTS

The manual or automatic sprinkler systems of the property are not tested or examined. These are not part of any property inspection. Area drains are not tested as part of this inspection and their condition is unknown. It is recommended that these be tested and cleaned as necessary to ensure they function properly.



GARAGE - CARPORT

Garage doors, starting in 1992, were required to have an electronic beam installed across the garage door opening to automatically reverse the garage door if there was a blockage of the beam. This prevents the door from closing and damaging people or objects that may be in the garage door opening when the door is operated. Prior to the above date, some garage doors had an automatic reverse feature that operated on pressure. If while descending, the door met resistance, it would automatically reverse and not continue to close.

Crawl spaces are observed in a cursory fashion and wood probing is not done and wood damage, dryrot and termites are not part of this inspection but part of the structural pest control operators report.

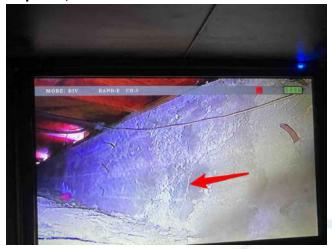

RAISED FOUNDATION Needs Attention:

The concrete foundation has some typical cracking, but was in functional condition for a building of this age. Cracking does not appear to be significant at this time. If a more detailed evaluation is required, it could be obtained from a structural engineer or foundation specialist.



There are chalky areas on the concrete. These are an indication that water has entered the concrete and crawl space during wet weather and brought salts out of the concrete when it came to the surface.

FOUNDATION BOLTING

The structure has some original anchor bolts. There are not many of these bolts and it does not meet today's standards that have been established for bolting. This would be evaluated by a foundation expert if additional work was to be undertaken to bring it up to these standards.

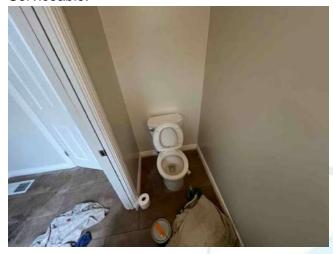

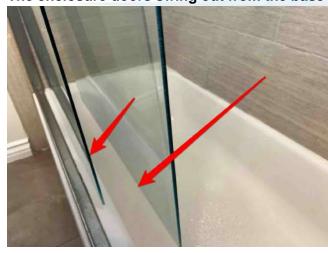

We do not move any furniture or personal belongings. This means that some deficiencies which were there may go unnoted or there may be items which are impossible to anticipate. We suggest that you plan for unforeseen repairs. This is part of property ownership as all buildings will have some of these repairs as well as normally occurring maintenance.

USE OF THE REPORT: The inspection report does not constitute a warranty, insurance policy or guarantee of any kind. It is confidential and is given solely for the use and benefit of the client and is not intended to be used for the benefit of or be relied upon by any other buyer or other third party.

PRE-INSPECTION AGREEMENT: Terms and conditions crucial to interpretation of the report are contained in a separate pre-inspection agreement. Do not use this report without consulting the pre-inspection agreement as use of this report constitutes the acceptance of all the terms, conditions and limitations in that agreement.

MOLD, MILDEW & FUNGI: Mold, mildew and fungus are specifically excluded from the inspection and the report. The inspector is not qualified to note the presence or absence of mold. In some cases mold has been found to be a serious problem and should not be overlooked. Because we do not inspect for mold, should you have any concerns at all about mold or the future discovery of mold, we always recommend that a buyer has a building inspected for mold during the contingency period and prior to the close of escrow.

WOOD DESTROYING ORGANISMS: Termites, dryrot, wood rot and wood destroying organisms are covered by the structural pest control operator's report. BUILDING CODES: This is not a building code or code compliance inspection. That is a different type of inspection performed by the local municipality, usually during construction. ASHI STANDARD OF PRACTICE FOR HOME INSPECTIONS

1. INTRODUCTION

The American Society of Home Inspectors®, Inc. (ASHI®) is a not-for-profit professional society established in 1976. Membership in ASHI is voluntary and its members are private home *inspectors*. ASHI's objectives include promotion of excellence within the profession and continual improvement of its members' *inspection* services to the public.

2. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

2.1 The purpose of this document is to establish a minimum standard (Standard) for *home inspections* performed by *home inspectors* who subscribe to this Standard. *Home inspections* performed using this Standard are intended to provide the client with information about the condition of inspected *systems* and *components* at the time of the *home inspection*.

2.2 The *inspector* shall:

2.

- **A.** *inspect readily accessible,* visually observable, *installed systems* and *components* listed in this Standard.
- **B.** provide the client with a written report, using a format and medium selected by the *inspector*, that states:
 - those systems and components inspected that, in the professional judgment of the inspector, are not functioning properly, significantly deficient, unsafe, or are near the end of their service lives,
 - recommendations to correct, or monitor for future correction, the deficiencies reported in 2.2.B.1, or items needing further evaluation (Per Exclusion 13.2.A.5 the inspector is NOT required to determine methods, materials, or costs of corrections.),
 - 3. reasoning or explanation as to the nature of the deficiencies reported in 2.2.B.1, that are not self-evident,
 - 4. those *systems* and *components* designated for inspection in this Standard that were present at the time of the *home inspection* but were not inspected and the reason(s) they were not inspected.
- **C.** adhere to the ASHI® Code of Ethics for the Home Inspection Profession.
- **2.3** This Standard is not intended to limit the *inspector* from:
 - **A.** including other services or *systems* and *components* in addition to those required in Section 2.2.A.
 - **B.** designing or specifying repairs, provided the *inspector* is appropriately qualified and willing to do so.
 - **C.** excluding *systems* and *components* from the *inspection* if requested or agreed to by the client.

3. STRUCTURAL COMPONENTS

3.1 The *inspector* shall:

- **A.** *inspect structural components* including the foundation and framing.
- B. describe:
 - 1. the methods used to inspect *under-floor crawlspaces* and attics.
 - 2. the foundation.
 - 3. the floor structure.
 - 4. the wall structure.
 - 5. the ceiling structure.
 - 6. the roof structure.

3.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to:

- **A.** provide *engineering* or architectural services or analysis.
- **B.** offer an opinion about the adequacy of *structural* systems and components.
- C. enter under-floor crawlspace areas that have less than 24 inches of vertical clearance between components and the ground or that have an access opening smaller than 16 inches by 24 inches.
- **D.** traverse attic load-bearing *components* that are concealed by insulation or by other materials.

4. EXTERIOR

4.1 The *inspector* shall:

- A. inspect:
 - 1. wall coverings, flashing, and trim.
 - 2. exterior doors.
 - 3. attached and adjacent decks, balconies, stoops, steps, porches, and their associated railings.
 - 4. eaves, soffits, and fascias where accessible from the ground level.
 - 5. vegetation, grading, surface drainage, and retaining walls that are likely to adversely affect the building.
 - adjacent and entryway walkways, patios, and driveways.
- B. describe wall coverings.

4.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to *inspect*:

- **A.** screening, shutters, awnings, and similar seasonal accessories.
- **B.** fences, boundary walls, and similar structures.
- **C.** geological and soil conditions.
- D. recreational facilities.
- E. outbuildings other than garages and carports.
- F. seawalls, break-walls, and docks.
- **G.** erosion control and earth stabilization measures.

5. ROOFING

5.1 The *inspector* shall:

- A. inspect:
 - 1. roofing materials.
 - 2. roof drainage systems.
 - 3. flashing.
 - 4. skylights, chimneys, and roof penetrations.
- B. describe:
 - 1. roofing materials.
 - 2. methods used to *inspect* the roofing.

5.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to *inspect*:

- A. antennas.
- **B.** interiors of vent *systems*, flues, and chimneys that are not *readily accessible*.
- C. other installed accessories.

6. PLUMBING

6.1 The *inspector* shall:

- A. inspect:
 - 1. interior water supply and distribution *systems* including fixtures and faucets.
 - interior drain, waste, and vent systems including fixtures.
 - 3. water heating equipment and hot water supply *systems*.
 - 4. vent systems, flues, and chimneys.
 - 5. fuel storage and fuel distribution systems.
 - 6. sewage ejectors, sump pumps, and related piping.

B. describe:

- 1. interior water supply, drain, waste, and vent piping materials
- 2. water heating equipment including energy source(s).
- 3. location of main water and fuel shut-off valves.

6.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to:

A. inspect.

- 1. clothes washing machine connections.
- 2. interiors of vent *systems*, flues, and chimneys that are not *readily accessible*.
- 3. wells, well pumps, and water storage related equipment.
- 4. water conditioning systems.
- solar, geothermal, and other renewable energy water heating systems.
- 6. manual and automatic fire extinguishing and sprinkler *systems* and landscape irrigation *systems*.
- 7. septic and other sewage disposal systems.
- B. determine:
 - 1. whether water supply and sewage disposal are public or private.
 - 2. water quality.
 - 3. the adequacy of combustion air components.
- **C.** measure water supply flow and pressure, and well water quantity.
- **D.** fill shower pans and fixtures to test for leaks.

7. ELECTRICAL

7.1 The *inspector* shall:

- A. inspect.
 - 1. service drop.
 - 2. service entrance conductors, cables, and raceways.
 - 3. service equipment and main disconnects.
 - 4. service grounding.
 - 5. interior *components* of service panels and subpanels.
 - 6. conductors.
 - 7. overcurrent protection devices.
 - 8. a *representative number* of *installed* lighting fixtures, switches, and receptacles.
 - 9. ground fault circuit interrupters and arc fault circuit interrupters.

B. describe:

- 1. amperage rating of the service.
- 2. location of main disconnect(s) and subpanels.
- 3. presence or absence of smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms.
- 4. the predominant branch circuit wiring method.

7.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to:

A. inspect.

- 1. remote control devices.
- 2. or test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, security *systems*, and other signaling and warning devices.
- 3. low voltage wiring systems and components.
- 4. ancillary wiring *systems* and *components* not a part of the primary electrical power distribution system.
- 5. solar, geothermal, wind, and other renewable energy *systems*.
- B. measure amperage, voltage, and impedance.
- C. determine the age and type of smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms.

8. HEATING

8.1 The *inspector* shall:

- A. open readily openable access panels.
- B. inspect.
 - 1. installed heating equipment.
 - 2. vent systems, flues, and chimneys.
 - 3. distribution systems.
- C. describe:
 - 1. energy source(s).
 - 2. heating systems.

8.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to:

A. inspect:

4.

- 1. interiors of vent *systems*, flues, and chimneys that are not *readily accessible*.
- 2. heat exchangers.
- 3. humidifiers and dehumidifiers.
- 4. electric air cleaning and sanitizing devices.
- 5. heating *systems* using ground-source, water-source, solar, and renewable energy technologies.
- 6. heat-recovery and similar whole-house mechanical ventilation *systems*.

B. determine:

- 1. heat supply adequacy and distribution balance.
- 2. the adequacy of combustion air components.

9. AIR CONDITIONING

9.1 The *inspector* shall:

- **A.** open readily openable access panels.
- B. inspect:
 - 1. central and permanently installed cooling equipment.
 - 2. distribution systems.
- C. describe:
 - 1. energy source(s).
 - 2. cooling systems.

9.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to:

- A. inspect electric air cleaning and sanitizing devices.
- B. determine cooling supply adequacy and distribution balance.
- **C.** *inspect* cooling units that are not permanently *installed* or that are *installed* in windows.
- **D.** *inspect* cooling *systems* using ground-source, water-source, solar, and renewable energy technologies.

10. INTERIORS

10.1 The inspector shall inspect:

- A. walls, ceilings, and floors.
- B. steps, stairways, and railings.
- **C.** countertops and a *representative number* of *installed* cabinets.
- **D.** a representative number of doors and windows.
- **E.** garage vehicle doors and garage vehicle door operators.
- **F.** *installed* ovens, ranges, surface cooking appliances, microwave ovens, dishwashing machines, and food waste grinders by using *normal operating controls* to activate the primary function.

10.2 The *inspector* is **NOT** required to *inspect*:

- A. paint, wallpaper, and other finish treatments.
- B. floor coverings.
- C. window treatments.
- D. coatings on and the hermetic seals between panes of window glass.

- E. central vacuum systems.
- F. recreational facilities.
- **G.** *installed* and free-standing kitchen and laundry appliances not listed in Section 10.1.F.
- H. appliance thermostats including their calibration, adequacy of heating elements, self cleaning oven cycles, indicator lights, door seals, timers, clocks, timed features, and other specialized features of the appliance.
- **I.** operate, or confirm the operation of every control and feature of an inspected appliance.

11. INSULATION AND VENTILATION

11.1 The *inspector* shall:

- A. inspect:
 - 1. insulation and vapor retarders in unfinished spaces.
 - 2. ventilation of attics and foundation areas.
 - 3. kitchen, bathroom, laundry, and similar exhaust *systems*.
 - 4. clothes dryer exhaust systems.
- B. describe:
 - 1. insulation and vapor retarders in unfinished spaces.
 - 2. absence of insulation in unfinished spaces at conditioned surfaces.

11.2 The inspector is NOT required to disturb insulation.

12. FIREPLACES AND FUEL-BURNING APPLIANCES

12.1 The *inspector* shall:

- A. inspect:
 - 1. fuel-burning fireplaces, stoves, and fireplace inserts.
 - 2. fuel-burning accessories *installed* in fireplaces.
 - 3. chimneys and vent systems.
- **B.** describe systems and components listed in 12.1.A.1 and .2.

12.2 The *inspector* is NOT required to:

- A. inspect:
 - 1. interiors of vent *systems*, flues, and chimneys that are not *readily accessible*.
 - 2. fire screens and doors.
 - 3. seals and gaskets.
 - 4. automatic fuel feed devices.

- 5. mantles and fireplace surrounds.
- 6. combustion air *components* and to determine their adequacy.
- 7. heat distribution assists (gravity fed and fan assisted).
- 8. fuel-burning fireplaces and appliances located outside the *inspected* structures.
- B. determine draft characteristics.
- **C.** move fireplace inserts and stoves or firebox contents.

13. GENERAL LIMITATIONS AND EXCLUSIONS

13.1 General limitations

- **A.** The *inspector* is NOT required to perform actions, or to make determinations, or to make recommendations not specifically stated in this Standard.
- **B.** *Inspections* performed using this Standard:
 - 1. are not technically exhaustive.
 - 2. are not required to identify and to report:
 - a. concealed conditions, latent defects, consequential damages, and
 - cosmetic imperfections that do not significantly affect a component's performance of its intended function.
- **C.** This Standard applies to buildings with four or fewer dwelling units and their attached and detached garages and carports.
- **D.** This Standard shall not limit or prevent the inspector from meeting state statutes which license professional home inspection and home inspectors.
- **E.** Redundancy in the description of the requirements, limitations, and exclusions regarding the scope of the *home inspection* is provided for emphasis only.

13.2 General exclusions

A. The *inspector* is NOT required to determine:

- 1. the condition of *systems* and *components* that are not *readily accessible*.
- 2. the remaining life expectancy of *systems* and *components*.
- 3. the strength, adequacy, effectiveness, and efficiency of *systems* and *components*.
- 4. the causes of conditions and deficiencies.
- 5. methods, materials, and costs of corrections.
- 6. future conditions including but not limited to failure of *systems* and *components*.
- 7. the suitability of the property for specialized uses.

- compliance of systems and components with past and present requirements and guidelines (codes, regulations, laws, ordinances, specifications, installation and maintenance instructions, use and care guides, etc.).
- 9. the market value of the property and its marketability.
- 10. the advisability of purchasing the property.
- 11. the presence of plants, animals, and other life forms and substances that may be hazardous or harmful to humans including, but not limited to, wood destroying organisms, molds and mold-like substances.
- 12. the presence of environmental hazards including, but not limited to, allergens, toxins, carcinogens, electromagnetic radiation, noise, radioactive substances, and contaminants in building materials, soil, water, and air.
- 13. the effectiveness of *systems installed* and methods used to control or remove suspected hazardous plants, animals, and environmental hazards.
- 14. operating costs of systems and components.
- 15. acoustical properties of systems and components.
- 16. soil conditions relating to geotechnical or hydrologic specialties.
- 17. whether items, materials, conditions and components are subject to recall, controversy, litigation, product liability, and other adverse claims and conditions.

B. The inspector is NOT required to offer:

- 1. or to perform acts or services contrary to law or to government regulations.
- or to perform architectural, engineering, contracting, or surveying services or to confirm or to evaluate such services performed by others.
- 3. or to perform trades or professional services other than *home inspection.*

Home Inspection The process by which an *inspector* visually examines the *readily accessible systems* and *components* of a home and *describes* those *systems* and *components* using this Standard

Inspect The process of examining *readily accessible systems* and *components* by (1) applying this Standard, and (2) operating *normal operating controls*, and (3) opening *readily openable access panels*

Inspector A person hired to examine *systems* and *components* of a building using this Standard

Installed Attached such that removal requires tools

Normal Operating Controls Devices such as thermostats, switches, and valves intended to be operated by the homeowner

Readily Accessible Available for visual inspection without requiring moving of personal property, dismantling, destructive measures, or actions that will likely involve risk to persons or property

Readily Openable Access Panel A panel provided for homeowner inspection and maintenance that is *readily accessible*, within normal reach, can be opened by one person, and is not sealed in place

Recreational Facilities Spas, saunas, steam baths, swimming pools, exercise, entertainment, athletic, playground and other similar equipment, and associated accessories

Representative Number One *component* per room for multiple similar interior *components* such as windows and electric receptacles; one *component* on each side of the building for multiple similar exterior *components*

Roof Drainage Systems *Components* used to carry water off a roof and away from a building

Shut Down A state in which a *system* or *component* cannot be operated by *normal operating controls*

Structural Component A *component* that supports non-variable forces or weights (dead loads) and variable forces or weights (live loads)

System A combination of interacting or interdependent *components*, assembled to carry out one or more functions

Technically Exhaustive An investigation that involves *dismantling*, the extensive use of advanced techniques, measurements, instruments, testing, calculations, or other means

Under-floor Crawlspace The area within the confines of the foundation and between the ground and the underside of the floor

Unsafe A condition in a *readily accessible, installed system* or *component* that is judged by the *inspector* to be a significant risk of serious bodily injury during normal, day-to-day use; the risk may be due to damage, deterioration, improper installation, or a change in accepted residential construction practices

Wall Covering A protective or insulating layer fixed to the outside of a building such as: aluminum, brick, EIFS, stone, stucco, vinyl, and wood

Wiring Method Identification of electrical conductors or wires by their general type, such as non-metallic sheathed cable, armored cable, and knob and tube, etc.

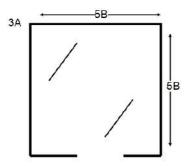

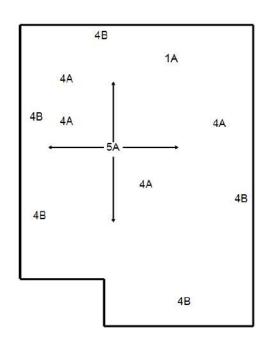

On November 18, 2024, we inspected the private sewage disposal system at the above-mentioned address. As a result of information supplied to us by others and upon our own observation and measurements at this site, we are reporting the current condition of the following.

Thus far, our inspection has revealed that the private sewage disposal system at this location consists of:

<u>Unit 1</u>: An approximate 852-gallon septic tank. <u>Unit 2</u>: A 18-ft deep below the surface seepage pit.

Unit 1: The septic tank is located in the front yard of the house. There is an 18-in diameter manhole with a green plastic manhole cover up to an inch or so below the surface for the inlet chamber of the tank. There is no access at the surface for the outlet chamber. We inspected the inlet chamber only. We did not excavate, uncover, open, or inspect the outlet chamber at this time. The tank is a "poured in place" style concrete septic tank. The T-fitting on the inlet end of the tank was in place and functional. The water level in the tank was a few inches higher than the normal water level for this tank. There were no signs of the water level rising any higher than this point which indicates that there may be a small partial obstruction. The top of the tank is approximately 2-ft 5-in deep below the surface. The septic tank is slightly smaller than required for a 3-bedroom house. This was common in the era that the tank was built back before the code was in place for septic tank sizes. There was a small build-up of solid waste and pumping is not needed for about another 2-years. The structural condition of the inlet chamber appeared to be satisfactory at the time of our inspection.

<u>Unit 2</u>: The seepage pit is located to the east of the septic tank. It has a standpipe up to the surface. The standpipe is a few feet away from the trunk of a large oak tree. We inspected the seepage pit through the standpipe. The top of the seepage pit is 2-ft 8-in deep below the surface. The water level was 10-ft deep below the surface. There are a lot of roots observed growing inside this seepage pit, but they do not appear to be affecting the proper functioning of the pit. There were no signs of any full or overfull conditions. We performed a percolation test on this seepage pit back in 2016 and it performed very well at that time.

Conclusions, Deficiencies, and Opinions for the Certification: The septic tank (Unit 1), was only partially inspected. The water level was slightly higher than the normal water level. The seepage pit (Unit 2), has no apparent functional deficiencies at this time.

Correctional, Optional, Maintenance, and Upgrade Recommendations:

- 1. Optional: If desired, the outlet chamber of the septic tank could be excavated, opened, and inspected. The cause of the elevated water level could also be further determined at this time while the outlet chamber is open and accessible. Range of Cost: \$1,500.00 to \$2,500.00 or more depending on any repairs needed.
- 2. Optional: If desired, a manhole could be installed up to the surface for easier access to the outlet chamber of the septic tank. Range of Cost: \$1,300.00 to \$1,800.00 or more depending on site conditions.

3. <u>Maintenance</u>: Other than the <u>Maintenance recommendations</u> listed below, there are no other recommendations at this time.

Maintenance recommendations: These Maintenance Recommendations are meant to apply to systems that are code compliant, sized correctly, installed properly, and are in normal working condition. We recommend pumping the cesspool/septic tank every 5-7 years, under normal conditions with a correctly sized unit. To maintain the effectiveness of the system, you may want to use a good quality bacterial product to keep the system functioning to its full potential. If desired, there is a new product called a Pirana Aerobic Bacteria Generator, which will keep a private sewage disposal system working well for many years with little maintenance. (www.pirana.biz) If a Pirana is installed, bacterial treatments is unnecessary. If you desire more information regarding the care and maintenance of this system, please call our office at 818-352-2253, and we will be happy to send you the latest brochures and information we have available.

The general Plumbing Code requirements for the septic tank size* in single-family residence applications are as follows: (the following chart applies to one structure only; multiple structures connected to one septic tank require a larger size septic tank; or each structure must have a separate private sewage disposal system if each has a kitchen.)

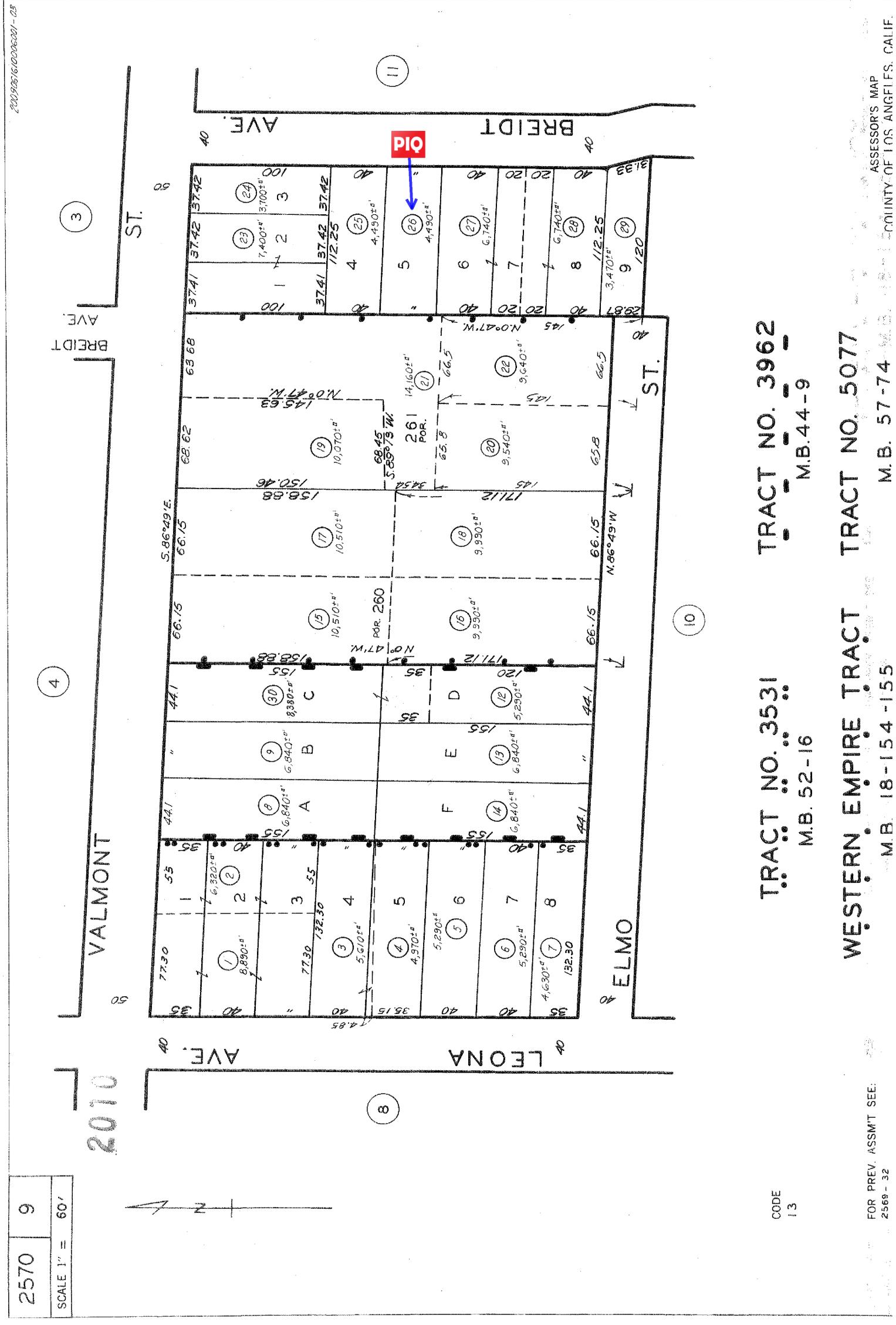

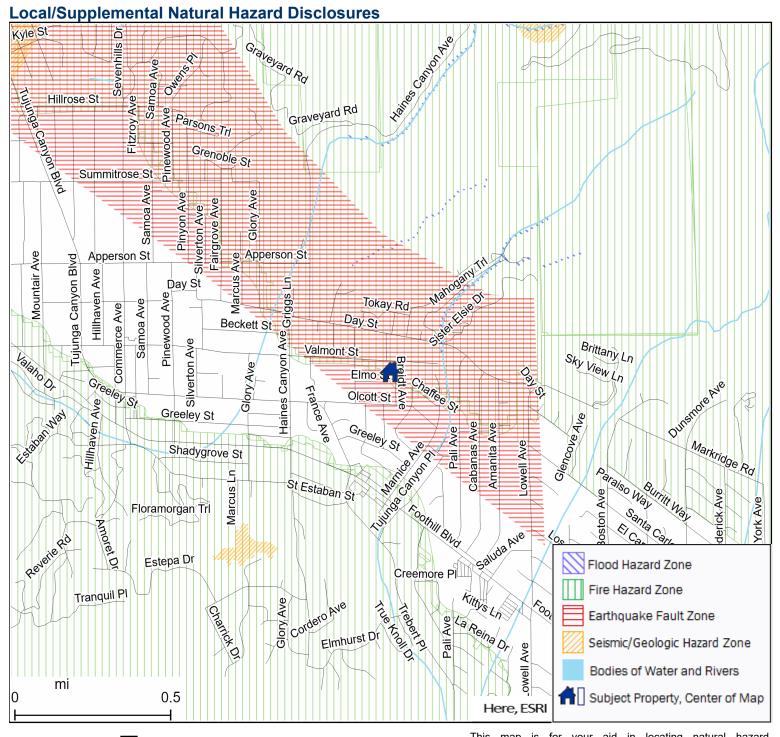

Improvement Bond Act of 1915 Assessments Districts provide a method of financing certain public capital improvements and infrastructures including, but not limited to, roads, sewer, water and storm drain systems, and street lighting. The money required to fund the improvement is obtained in advance through the issuance of municipal bonds pursuant to the Improvement Bond Act of 1915. A special assessment lien is placed on the property within the Assessment District. Payments on the assessment contract will be made through an additional annual assessment on the property and paid either directly to the county tax collector's office as part of the total annual secured property tax bill, or through the property owner's mortgage impound account. If the property owner pays his or her taxes through an impound account he or she should notify their mortgage lender to discuss adjusting his or her monthly mortgage payment by the estimated monthly cost of the PACE assessment. Under the PACE programs, if the property is sold before the PACE financing is paid in full, the remaining payments may be passed on to the new property owner. However, a lender may require the property owner to pay off the remaining balance when the property is sold or refinanced. The remaining debt may affect the amount a new buyer can borrow when financing the property purchase. It is the responsibility of the property owner to contact the property owner's home insurance provider to determine whether the efficiency improvement to be financed by the PACE assessment is covered by the property owner's insurance plan. 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PROPERTY TAX DESCRIPTIONS

Basic Property Taxes

The Basic Levy is the primary property tax charge levied by the County on behalf of government agencies. As a result of the passage of Proposition 13 in 1978 (Article XIIIA of the California State Constitution), the basic levy is limited to one percent (1%) of the property's net assessed value. Proceeds from this tax are divided by the County and used to help fund nearly every function the state, county, city and other local municipal agencies provide. All other charges that appear on the tax bill vary by district and county.

Voter Approved Taxes

Voter Approved Debt are taxes levied on a parcel that is calculated based on the assessed value of the parcel. Taxes may include those taxes that were approved by voters before the passage of Proposition 13 in 1978, General Obligation Bonds or Special Taxes that are based on assessed value as opposed to some other method. Taxes that were established before 1978 may be used for various services and improvements and may or may not be associated with public indebtedness (the issuance of municipal bonds). A General Obligation Bond is a municipal bond that may be issued by a city, county or school district in order to finance the acquisition and construction of public capital facilities and real property. Equipment purchases and the cost of operation and maintenance cannot be financed with a General Obligation Bond. Special Taxes are created pursuant to various California Code Sections and require 2/3 majority approval of the qualified voters for approval. A special tax may be formed by a local government (a city, county, special district, etc) in order to finance specific facilities and/or services and cannot be used for general purposes.

Other Direct Assessments

In addition to the items discussed in the previous sections, real property may be subject to Other Direct Assessments. These assessments may appear on the annual property tax bill. Increases or modifications to these assessments are subject to public notice/hearing requirements (as governed by law) and require a vote by the legal property owners or the registered voters in the area. Additional information is available by contacting the agency actually levying the assessment.

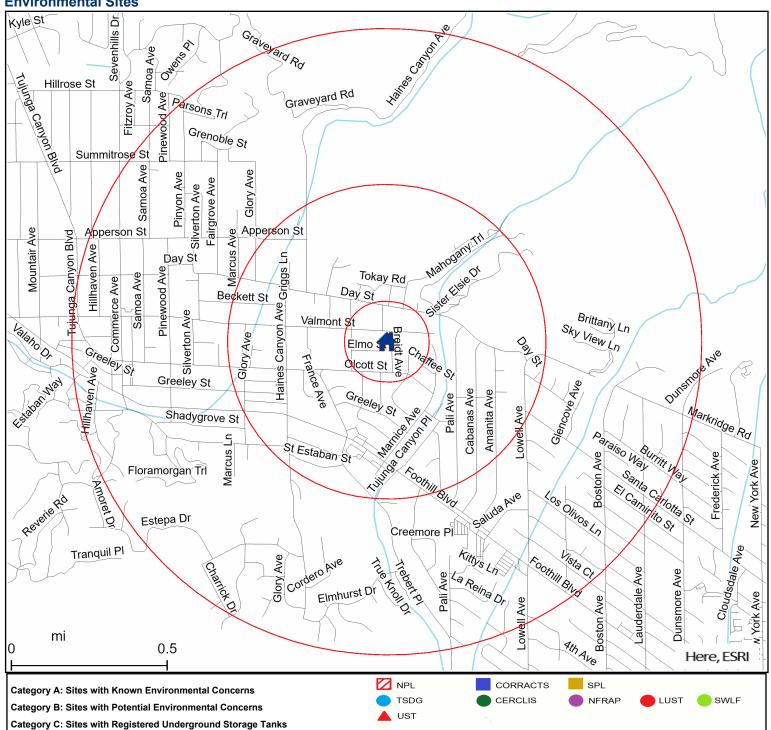

Potential Status Field Definitions:

Abandoned: A site that has ceased accepting waste but is not closed pursuant to applicable statutes, regulations and local ordinances in effect at that time, and where there is no responsible party as determined by the local enforcement agency and board.

Absorbed: An operational status used only when existing facilities (permitted facilities) are being combined into a single.

Active: Identifies that an investigation and/or remediation is currently in progress and that DTSC is actively involved, either in a lead or support capacity. Or a facility/operation currently accepting, handling, processing, or disposing waste.

ACW (Asbestos Containing Waste) Disposal Site: A solid waste landfill that accepts asbestos containing waste.

Backlog: Identifies non-active sites which DTSC is not currently investigating or remediating. These sites generally become active when staff and/or financial resources are available. Priorities for placing a site on backlog status versus active are based on the degree of long-term threat posed by the property. Before placing a property on backlog status, DTSC considers whether interim actions are necessary to protect the public and the environment from any immediate hazard posed by the property. Often there are no parties available to fund the full cleanup of these properties.

Border Zone/Haz Waste Property (BZP/HWP): Identifies properties that went through the Border Zone Property or Hazardous Waste Property process of evaluation. Potential Border Zone properties are located within 2,000 feet of a significant disposal of hazardous waste; Hazardous Waste Property facilities/sites have a significant disposal of hazardous waste.

Case Closed: The Regional Board and the Local Agency have determined that no further work is necessary at the site.

Certified: Identifies completed sites with previously confirmed release that are subsequently certified by DTSC as having been remediated satisfactorily under DTSC oversight.

Certified Operation & Maintenance: Identifies sites that have certified cleanups in place but require ongoing Operation and Maintenance (O&M) activities. The Certified O&M status designation means that all planned activities necessary to address the contamination problems have been implemented. However, some of these remedial activities (such as pumping and treating contaminated groundwater) must be continued for many years before complete cleanup will be achieved. Prior to the Certified O&M designation, all institutional controls (e.g., land use restrictions) that are necessary to protect public health must be in place.



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Clean closed: A solid waste disposal site that has documentation of the removal of solid waste on file with the Board. When a site is clean closed, the site is considered to cease to exist as a solid waste disposal site, but records are kept to document the status of the site.

Closed: A solid waste facility, site or operation that has ceased accepting, handling, or disposing of waste (and is not inactive) and/or has documentation that closure was conducted in accordance with applicable statutes, regulations, and local ordinances in effect at the time.

Closing: A site that has ceased accepting waste and is undergoing closure consistent with an approved final closure plan. Closing applies to landfills or disposal sites undergoing closure operations pursuant to closure plan development and implementation up to certification of closure.

Completed - Case Closed: A closure letter or other formal closure decision document has been issued for the site.

Completed - Case Closed/No Monitoring: A land disposal site that ceased accepting waste and was closed in accordance with applicable statutes, regulations, and local ordinances in effect at time of closure. The land disposal site was monitored for at least thirty years and Water Board staff has determined that wastes no longer pose a threat to water quality.

Excluded: A waste tire site that does not meet the definition of a major or minor waste tire facility.

Deleted: Deleted from the Final NPL.

Final: Currently on the Final NPL.

Hazardous Waste Border Zone Property (HWP/BZP): Potential Border Zone properties are located within 2,000 feet of a significant disposal of hazardous waste, and hazardous waste property sites having significant disposal of hazardous waste.

Hazardous Waste Disposal Land Use (NOT BZP/HWP): Identifies facilities/sites that went through the Hazardous Waste or Border Zone Property process and entered into voluntary deed restrictions, but were not formally designated as either a "Border Zone" or "Hazardous Waste Property".

Inactive - Action Required: Identifies non-active sites where, through a Preliminary Endangerment Assessment (PEA) or other evaluation, DTSC has determined that a removal or remedial action or further extensive investigation is required.

Inactive - Needs Evaluation: Identifies non-active sites where DTSC has determined a PEA or other evaluation is required.

No Action Required: Identifies sites where a Phase I Environmental Assessment was completed and resulted in a no action required determination.

No Further Action: Identifies completed sites where DTSC determined after investigation, generally a PEA (an initial assessment), that the property does not pose a problem to public health or the environment.

Non-Operating: A Treatment, Storage, Disposal or Transfer Facility (TSDTF) with no operating hazardous waste management unit(s).

Non-Operating Permit: A facility that has received a hazardous waste facility permit but, has no hazardous waste management operating unit (s). This could be a post-closure permit.

Not Currently Regulated: Never regulated by the Board or no longer subject to the Board's regulation. In the case of waste tire locations below 500 tires or tire facilities that have reduced the tire count to under 500.

Not Proposed: Not on the NPL.

Not Reported: The status was not reported by the Lead Agency.

Open - Assessment & Interim Remedial Action: An "interim" remedial action is occurring at the site AND additional activities such as site characterization, investigation, risk evaluation, and/or site conceptual model development are occurring.

Open - Eligible for Closure: Corrective action at the Site has been determined to be completed and any remaining petroleum constituents from the release are considered to be low threat to Human Health, Safety, and the Environment.

Open - Inactive: No regulatory oversight activities are being conducted by the Lead Agency.

Open - Remediation: An approved remedy or remedies has/have been selected for the impacted media at the site and the responsible party (RP) is implementing one or more remedy under an approved cleanup plan for the site.

Open - Closed/with Monitoring: A land disposal site that has ceased accepting waste and was closed in accordance with applicable statutes, regulations, and local ordinances in effect at time of closure.

Open - Closing/with Monitoring: A land disposal site that is no longer accepting waste and is undergoing all operations necessary to prepare the site for post-closure maintenances in accordance with an approved plan for closure.

Open - Inactive: A land disposal site that has ceased accepting waste but has not been formally closed or is still within the post closure monitoring period.

Open - Operating: A land disposal site that is accepting waste.

Open - Proposed: A land disposal site that is in the process of undergoing the permit process from several agencies.

Open - Site Assessment: Site characterization, investigation, risk evaluation, and/or site conceptual model development are occurring at the site. Examples of site assessment activities include, but are not limited to, the following: 1) identification of the contaminants and the investigation of their potential impacts; 2) determination of the threats/impacts to water quality; 3) evaluation of the risk to humans and ecology; 4) delineation of the nature and extent of contamination; 5) delineation of the contaminant plume(s); and 6) development of the Site Conceptual Model.

Open - Verification Monitoring: Remediation phases are essentially complete and a monitoring/sampling program is occurring to confirm successful completion of cleanup at the Site. (e.g. No "active" remediation is considered necessary or no additional "active" remediation is anticipated as needed. Active remediation system(s) has/have been shut-off and the potential for a rebound in contaminant concentrations is under evaluation).

Operating: A Treatment, Storage, Disposal or Transfer (TSDTF) Facility with an operating hazardous waste management unit(s).

Part of NPL: Site is Part of a NPL Site.

Permitted: Indicates that a facility or site held a solid waste facility permit.

Planned: A facility in the planning stages. It may be awaiting a permit and not yet accepting waste or it may be permitted but not yet constructed or accepting

Pollution Characterization: The responsible party is in the process of installing additional monitoring wells and/or borings in order to fully define the lateral and vertical extent of contamination in soil and ground water and assess the hydrogeology of the area. This phase of work may also include performing aquifer tests, soil gas surveys, continued ground water gradient determinations and monitoring, and assessing impacts on surface and/or ground water.

Post Remedial Action Monitoring: Periodic ground water or other monitoring at the site, as necessary, in order to verify and/or evaluate the effectiveness of remedial action.

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Pre-Title 27 CAI - Open/With Monitoring: A waste management unit that was closed, abandoned or inactive prior to November 27, 1984 (Pre-Title 27) and has monitoring data indicating the unit has the potential to adversely affect water quality. The site has been reopened (post-1984) and is under a detection monitoring program or implementing a corrective action program.

Pre-Title 27 CAI - Closed/With Monitoring: A waste management unit that was abandoned or inactive prior to November 27, 1984 (Pre-Title 27) but was not formally and completely closed. The site has the potential to adversely affect water quality and is implementing a detection monitoring program.

Pre-Title 27 CAI - Closed/No Monitoring: A waste management unit that was abandoned or inactive (CAI) prior to November 27, 1984 (Pre-Title 27) but was not formally and completely closed and is not implementing a monitoring program. The unit has the potential to adversely affect water quality.

Pre-Title 27 CAI - Completed - Case Closed/No Monitoring: A waste management unit that was formally and completely closed prior to November 27, 1984 (Pre-Title 27) in accordance with applicable statutes, regulations, and local ordinances in effect at time of closure. The unit does not pose a threat to

Preliminary Endangerment Assessment: An assessment of information about a site and its surrounding area. Generally includes historical review of documents and may include limited sampling of a site.

Preliminary Site Assessment Underway: Implementation of a work plan addressing the Preliminary Site Assessment Work Plan.

Referred: IWMB: Identifies sites that, based on limited information available to DTSC, appear to be more appropriately addressed by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (IWMB).

Referred: Other Agency: Identifies sites that, based on limited information available to DTSC, appear to be more appropriately addressed by another state or local environmental regulatory agency.

Suspended: Indicates that the facility, operation or site never had or does not have a Solid Waste Facility Permit.

To Be Determined: There is presently not enough information to determine a Regulatory Status or Operational Status. This information may be gathered as part of the Site Investigation Process (SIP) which includes completion of the Site Identification form and Site Assessment form or further investigation by the enforcement agency. Additionally, the operational or regulatory status may be pending permit action, enforcement action, or ongoing investigation.

Unknown - Insufficient Information.

Unpermitted: Indicates that the facility, operation or site never had or does not have a Solid Waste Facility Permit.

NOTICES AND ADVISORIES

TRANSFER FEE NOTICE

This is commonly known as a "Private Transfer Tax". It is a fee imposed by a private entity such as a property developer, home builder, or home owner association, when a property within a certain type of subdivision is sold or transferred. A private transfer fee may also be imposed by an individual property owner. Private transfer fees are different from city or county Documentary Transfer Taxes. Private Transfer Fees may apply in addition to government Documentary Transfer Taxes that are due upon sale or transfer of the property.

California Civil Code Section 1098 defines a "Transfer Fee" as "any fee payment requirement imposed within a covenant, restriction, or condition contained in any deed, contract, security instrument, or other document affecting the transfer or sale of, or any interest in, real property that requires a fee be paid as a result of transfer of the real property." Certain existing fees such as government fees, court ordered fees, mechanic lien fees, common interest development fees, etc. are specially excluded from the definition of "Transfer Fee".

To determine if the property is subject to a Transfer Fee, OBTAIN COPIES OF ALL EXCEPTIONS LISTED ON THE PRELIMINARY TITLE REPORT FROM THE TITLE COMPANY AND READ THEM TO DETERMINE IF ANY TRANSFER FEES ARE APPLICABLE. Please be aware that private transfer fees may be difficult to identify by simply reading the title report.

Effective January 1, 2008, Civil Code Section 1102.6e requires the seller to notify the buyer of whether a private transfer fee applies and if present, to disclose certain specific information about the fee.

Content of Disclosure. Civil Code Section 1102.6e requires the seller to disclose specific information about any Transfer Fee that may affect the property. Please refer to the legal code or to the C.A.R. Form NTF (11/07), provided by the California Association of Realtors, for a standard format to use in making the Transfer Fee Disclosure if you elect to investigate and make this disclosure personally.

How to Determine the Existence of a Transfer Fee. If a Transfer Fee does exist affecting the property, the document creating the fee may be on file with the County Recorder as a notice recorded against the property and should be disclosed in the preliminary title report on the property. However, the preliminary title report will merely disclose the existence of the documents affecting title, not the content of the documents. The title of a document may also not be sufficient to disclose that a transfer fee is included in its terms. Accordingly seller should (a) request the title company which issued the preliminary title report to provide copies of the documents shown as "exceptions" and (b) review each document to determine if it contains a transfer fee.

NOTICE OF YOUR "SUPPLEMENTAL" PROPERTY TAX BILL

California Civil Code 1102.6c, states that the seller, or his or her agent, is responsible for delivering a notice specifying information about supplemental tax assessments:

"California property tax law requires the Assessor to revalue real property at the time the ownership of the property changes. Because of this law, you may receive one or two supplemental tax bills, depending on when your loan closes. The supplemental tax bills are not mailed to your lender. If you have arranged for your property tax payments to be paid through an impound account, the supplemental tax bills will not be paid by your lender. It is your responsibility to pay these supplemental bills directly to the tax collector. If you have any question concerning this matter, please call your local tax collector's office."

TOXIC MOLD NOTICE (PURSUANT TO THE "TOXIC MOLD PROTECTION ACT OF 2001")

The seller, or lessor of residential, commercial or industrial property; or a public entity that owns, leases, or operates a building should provide a written disclosure to prospective purchasers, prospective tenants, renters, or occupants if the seller, lessor or public entity has knowledge of mold conditions or in specified instances has reasonable cause to believe, that mold (visible or hidden) that exceeds permissible exposure limits is present that affects the unit or building. The State Department of Health Services is designated as the lead agency for identifying, adopting, and determining permissible exposure limits to mold in indoor environments, mold identification and remediation efforts.

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GAS AND HAZARDOUS LIQUID TRANSMISSION PIPELINES NOTICE

The following notice is provided to the buyer(s) of real property regarding information about the general location of gas and hazardous liquid transmission pipelines.

NOTICE REGARDING GAS AND HAZARDOUS LIQUID TRANSMISSION PIPELINES

This notice is being provided simply to inform you that information about the general location of gas and hazardous liquid transmission pipelines is available to the public via the National Pipeline Mapping System (NPMS) Internet Web site maintained by the United States Department of Transportation at https://pvnpms.phmsa.dot.gov/PublicViewer/. To seek further information about possible transmission pipelines near the property, you may contact your local gas utility or other pipeline operators in the area. Contact information for pipeline operators is searchable by ZIP Code and county on the NPMS Internet Web site.

Gas and hazardous liquid pipelines of any size pose a potential risk to life, property and the environment if damaged or punctured. In addition, precise locations of larger gas transmission pipelines are restricted by Federal Homeland Security policies. You should also review your Preliminary Title Report for pipelines right-of-way (easements) and further investigate information about pipelines by contacting the owner or operator responsible for the pipelines, consider what factors, if any, are associated with the property's proximity to pipelines, and determine whether the information you receive is acceptable before you purchase. No excavation work should be done before contacting the One-Call Center (811).

FLOOD INSURANCE NOTICE

Floods can have a devastating effect on communities, causing loss of life, property damage, and loss of income, and can have an adverse effect on government functioning. As such, the federal government has designed measures that are intended to aid disaster assistance by encouraging insurance coverage for those properties in flood disaster areas.

In addition to the flood disclosure in the Natural Hazard Disclosure Statement, Federal law {U.S. Code Title 42, Chapter 68, subchapter III, § 5154a(b)(1)} requires a seller, no later than the date on which a property is to be transferred, to notify a buyer of the requirement to purchase and maintain flood insurance, if disaster relief assistance (including a loan assistance payment) has been previously provided on that property and such assistance was conditioned on obtaining flood insurance according to Federal law. If a buyer fails to obtain and maintain flood insurance on a property disclosed to have been in a previous federal disaster area and that received disaster relief assistance, then no Federal disaster relief assistance will made available should that property subsequently be in a flood disaster area. If a seller fails to notify a buyer of the requirement to purchase and maintain flood insurance because of said property's inclusion in a Federal disaster area and Federal disaster relief assistance was received for that property, and the buyer does not obtain and maintain flood insurance, then should that property be damaged by a flood disaster and receive Federal disaster relief assistance, the seller will be required to reimburse the Federal Government for the amount of that assistance for that property.

State law (SBX17, Chaptered October 10, 1995) also prohibits "state disaster assistance from being provided to a person required to maintain flood insurance by state or federal law, who has canceled or failed to maintain that coverage."

The information contained here is not intended to indicate whether a property has been in a Federal disaster area and has received Federal disaster relief assistance, but merely to indicate an additional flood insurance disclosure requirement related to future disaster relief assistance availability.



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ENERGY EFFICIENCY STANDARDS AND DUCT SEALING REQUIREMENTS NOTICE

The Energy Policy and Conservation Act directs the Department of Energy (DOE) to establish minimum efficiency standards for various products, including central air conditioners and heat pumps. On January 1, 2015, the DOE amended the energy conservation standards for residential central air conditioners and heat pumps manufactured for sale in the United States to be manufactured with an energy rating of 14 SEER (SEER, Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio, is the measurement of energy efficiency for the cooling performance of central air conditioners and heat pumps). Homeowners are not required to replace or upgrade existing central air conditioning units or heat pumps to comply with the new standards. Disclosure Source recommends that the potential buyer of the subject property verify the SEER rating of the central air conditioning or heat pump system through a professional such as a home inspector or through the California Home Energy Efficiency Rating Services. This agency, a home energy rating provider, is a non-profit organization that promotes energy efficiency through comprehensive analyses of homes. Additional information may be found at:

Additionally, beginning October 1, 2005, and with subsequent revisions to the California building energy efficiency standards, the California Energy Commission ("CEC") outlined new duct sealing requirements which require the home's ducts tested for leaks when the central air conditioner or furnace is installed or replaced. Ducts that leak 15 percent or more must be repaired to reduce the leaks. After your contractor tests and fixes the ducts, you need to have an approved third-party field verifier check to make sure the duct testing and sealing was done properly. Duct sealing is generally not required in the following situations: 1) duct systems that are documented to have been previously sealed as confirmed through field verification and diagnostic testing; 2) when systems have less than 40 feet of ductwork in unconditioned spaces like attics, garages, crawlspaces, basements or outside the building, or 3) when ducts are constructed, insulated or sealed with asbestos. There also are specific alternatives that allow high efficiency equipment and added duct insulation to be installed instead of fixing duct leaks. You also should know that any contractor failing to obtain a required building permit and failing to test and repair your ducts is violating the law and exposing you to additional costs and liability. Real estate law requires you to disclose to potential buyers and appraisers whether or not you obtained required permits for work done on your house. If you do not obtain a permit, you may be required to bring your home into compliance with code requirements for that work and you may have to pay penalty permit fees and fines prior to selling your home. According to the CEC, these duct sealing requirements apply when the following are replaced: the air handler, the outdoor condensing unit of a split system air conditioner or heat pump, the cooling or heating coil, or the furnace heat exchanger. Several cities and counties have adopted more stringent building energy standards. You can find a link to the modif

WATER-CONSERVING PLUMBING FIXTURE NOTICE

The seller of single-family residential real property built on or before January 1, 1994 shall disclose, in writing, to the prospective buyer that Section 1101.4 of the Civil Code requires that California single-family residences be equipped with water-conserving plumbing fixtures on or before January 1, 2017, and whether the property includes any noncompliant plumbing fixtures as defined in subdivision(c) of Section 1101.3.

Further, on and after January 1, 2019, a seller of multifamily residential real property or of commercial real property built on or before January 1, 1994 shall disclose to the prospective buyer, in writing, that all noncompliant plumbing fixtures in any multifamily residential real property and in any commercial real property shall be replaced with water-conserving plumbing fixtures on or before January 1, 2019, and whether the property includes any noncompliant plumbing fixtures.

For purposes of these requirements, noncompliant plumbing fixtures mean any toilet manufactured to use more than 1.6 gallons of water per flush, any urinal manufactured to use more than one gallon of water per flush, any showerhead manufactured to have a flow capacity of more than 2.5 gallons of water per minute, any interior faucet that emits more than 2.2 gallons of water per minute.

SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS NOTICE

On and after January 1, 2018, a seller of residential real property within a common interest development shall disclose to the prospective buyer (s) the existence of any solar energy system owned by the seller and the related responsibilities of the owner according to California Civil Code Section 4746. The owner and each successive owner is required to maintain a homeowner liability coverage policy at all times and to provide the homeowner's association with the corresponding certificate of insurance within 14 days of approval of the application and annually thereafter. The owner and each successive owner of the solar energy system is responsible for the costs of damage to the common area, exclusive use common area, or separate interests resulting from the installation, maintenance, repair, removal, or replacement of the solar energy system. Further, the owner and each successive owner of the solar energy system is responsible for the costs of maintenance, repair, and replacement of the solar energy system until it has been removed and for the restoration of the common area, exclusive use common area, or separate interests after removal. The new owner will be responsible for the same disclosures mentioned above to subsequent buyers.



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REGISTERED SEX OFFENDER DATABASE NOTICE ALSO KNOWN AS "MEGAN'S LAW"

For more than 50 years, California has required sex offenders to register with their local law enforcement agencies. However, information on the whereabouts of these sex offenders was not available to the public until the implementation of the Child Molester Identification Line in July 1995. The information available was further expanded by California's Megan's Law in 1996 (Chapter 908, Stats. of 1996).

Section 2079.10a of the California Civil Code specifies notice be provided to buyer(s) of real property of the existence of a registered sex offender database:

Notice: Pursuant to Section 290.46 of the Penal Code, information about specified registered sex offenders is made available to the public via an Internet Web site maintained by the Department of Justice at www.meganslaw.ca.gov. Depending on an offender's criminal history, this information will include either the address at which the offender resides or the community of residence and ZIP Code in which he or she resides.

The public, excluding those who have registered as sex offenders pursuant to Section 290 of the Penal Code, may search this database by a sex offender's specific name, obtain ZIP Code and city/county listings, obtain detailed personal profile information on each registrant, and use the map application to search a neighborhood or anywhere throughout the State to determine the specific location of any of those registrants on whom the law allows the State of California to display a home address.

In addition, the public may also contact the California Department of Justice, Sex Offender Tracking Program, for information on making an inquiry with the Department concerning at least six individuals as to whether any are required to register as a sex offender and subject to public notification. A fee is assessed for such inquiries, which will be deposited into the Sexual Predator Public Information Account within the Department of Justice. The contact number for the Sex Offender Tracking Program is (916) 227-4974.

METHAMPHETAMINE OR FENTANYL CONTAMINATED PROPERTY NOTICE

California law (Health and Safety Code Section 25400.28) requires property owners to notify prospective buyers in writing of any pending order that would prevent the use or occupancy of a property because of methamphetamine or fentanyl laboratory activity, and to provide the prospective buyer with a copy of the pending order. Receipt of a copy of the pending order shall be acknowledged in writing by the prospective buyer.

The "Methamphetamine or Fentanyl Contaminated Property Cleanup Act," chapter 6.9.1 specifies human occupancy standards for property that is subject to the act. These standards will be replaced by any that are devised by the Department of Toxic Substances Control, in consultation with the Office of Environmental Substances Control. In addition, this Act outlines procedures for local authorities in dealing with methamphetamine or fentanyl contaminated properties, including the use of a property lien. This notice is meant to inform prospective buyers of California disclosure law regarding methamphetamine or fentanyl lab activity, and does not indicate or imply that a particular property is or has been contaminated according to this law.

MILITARY ORDNANCE LOCATION NOTICE

California Civil Code Section §1102.15 states "The seller of residential real property subject to this article who has actual knowledge of any former federal or state ordnance locations within the neighborhood area shall give written notice of that knowledge as soon as practicable before transfer of title."

For purposes of this notice, "former federal or state ordnance locations" means an area identified by an agency or instrumentality of the federal or state government as an area once used for military training purposes, which may contain potentially explosive munitions.

"Neighborhood area" means within one mile of the residential real property.

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CALIFORNIA LAND CONSERVATION (WILLIAMSON) ACT NOTICE

The purpose of the California Land Conservation Act of 1965 (Williamson Act) is to allow local governments and private landowners to enter voluntarily into contracts to restrict the use of parcels of land of no less than 100 acres to agricultural and open space use. The landowner receives compensation for the land use restrictions in the form of reduced property tax assessments which are much lower than normal because they are based upon farming and open space uses as opposed to full market value.

A Williamson Act contract is initially for a minimum term of ten years but local jurisdictions have the option to increase the initial term up to twenty years. Williamson Act contracts run with the land and are binding on all subsequent landowners. The contract is automatically extended by one year after the tenth and subsequent years unless a request for non-renewal is filed by either party. A request for non-renewal begins a 9 year term during which the tax assessments gradually increase to the full fair market value at which time the contract is terminated. The use of the property will then be controlled by the local jurisdiction's use and zoning laws.

Williamson Act contracts can be canceled only by the landowner's petition; however the minimum penalty for canceling a contract is 12.5 percent of the unrestricted, fair market value of the property. To approve a tentative contract cancellation, a county or city must make specific findings that are supported by substantial evidence. The existence of an opportunity for another use of the property or the uneconomic character of an existing agricultural use shall not, by itself, be a sufficient reason to cancel a contract.

There are penalties for breach of a contract, caused by the owner intentionally using the land for other than agriculture or making the land unusable for the contracted purposes. The penalties for breach of contract are as much as 25% of the unrestricted fair market value of the land rendered incompatible, plus 25% of the value of any building and any related improvements on the contracted land that cause the breach of contract. If a local jurisdiction allows a contract to be canceled and the State determines that there is a breach of contract, the penalties may be reduced, but not to less than 12.5% of the value of the land.

Contact the planning department to obtain information on requirements for entering into a Williamson Act contract and the uses allowed. Local government uniform rules and the specific Williamson Act contract can be more restrictive than the Williamson Act Government Code provisions.

MUDSLIDE / DEBRIS FLOW ADVISORY

Wildfires dramatically alter the terrain and ground conditions. Post wildfire rainstorms can produce dangerous flash floods, mudslides, and debris flows. These events are a threat to property located within or along an area which has experienced a recent wildfire.

This advisory is provided to simply inform you about the US Geologic Survey's maps that estimate the probability and volume of debris flow that may be produced by a storm in a recently burned area. They are available at:

OIL, GAS WELLS & METHANE ADVISORY

California's oil and gas production has been in decline since the 1980's and wells, many of which were drilled at the turn of the past century, have been shut down or improperly abandoned. Such wells are often found when they begin to leak oil, natural gas (methane), or water. Building construction in the past several years has expanded into areas where wells were once, or are, active. Buyer should be aware that wells may exist on or near any property and new construction may also be restricted in the vicinity of wells. The California Division of Oil, Gas and Geothermal Resources administers the program to properly abandon wells. Abandoned or active oil wells, areas containing petroleum deposits, oil fields, landfills, and gas storage facilities could present risks and safety hazards to life, health, and natural resources. Risks could include, but are not limited to, soil and ground water contamination, physical safety hazards to humans and animals, fire hazards, oil and methane seeps, and air quality problems.

Migration of methane gas into areas containing impermeable surfaces (i.e. concrete, pavement, basements, etc.) can trap the gas, resulting in the accumulation of high concentrations. Although natural methane gas is relatively harmless, high concentrations of it can be hazardous due to its highly combustible chemical composition, as well as its ability to displace oxygen. Properties located in a methane zone may be required to undergo testing and mitigation. Disclosure Source recommends that the buyer contact the local Planning, Building and Safety Department to ascertain what previous measures, if any, might have been taken to properly vent the area and what considerations might apply regarding building permits or renovations. 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HABITAT SENSITIVITY AREA / ENDANGERED SPECIES ADVISORY

The California Endangered Species Act, Fish and Game Code, section 2051, states that there are certain species of fish, wildlife and plants that are in danger of, or threatened with, extinction because their habitats are being threatened, destroyed or adversely modified. Legislation declares that landowner cooperation is essential for conservation on those lands that have been identified as a habitat for endangered or threatened species. According to Section 2052.1 of the Fish and Game Code, if a person needs to address mitigation measures in relation to a particular impact on a threatened species, then those measures will be roughly proportional to the impact that the person has on those species. Disclosure Source recommends the buyer contact the local planning department and the California Department of Fish & Wildlife to ascertain what, if any, considerations might be involved as a result of being in or nearby habitat sensitive areas. NATURALLY OCCURRING ASBESTOS ADVISORY

Asbestos is the common name for a group of silicate minerals that are made of thin, strong fibers. It occurs naturally in certain geologic settings in California, most commonly in ultrabasic and ultramafic rock, including serpentine rock. These rocks are commonly found in the Sierra Foothills, the Klamath Mountains, Coast Ranges, and along some faults. While asbestos is more likely found in these rock formations, its presence is not certain. Because asbestos is a mineral, asbestos fibers are generally stable in the natural environment. The fibers will not evaporate into the air. Some naturally occurring asbestos can become friable, or crushed into a powder. This may occur when vehicles drive over unpaved roads or driveways that are surfaced with ultrabasic, ultramafic or serpentine rock, when land is graded for building purposes, or at quarrying operations. Weathering and erosion may also naturally release asbestos. Friable asbestos can become suspended in the air, and under these conditions, asbestos fibers represent a significant risk to human health. Asbestos is a known carcinogen, and inhalation of asbestos may result in the development of lung cancer. RADON ADVISORY

Radon is a colorless, odorless radioactive gas that is produced by the natural decay of uranium, which is found in nearly all soils and rocks. Radon can seep from the ground into the air in a property through openings in the ground, and its presence increases the risk of lung cancer. Radon levels are variable and may be influenced by not only geology, but also soil permeability, weather and climatic conditions, building design, condition and usage. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has produced a map that assigns one of three zone designations to each county based on radon potential and each zone designation reflects the average short-term radon measurement that can be expected to be measured in a building without the implementation of radon control methods. That map is not meant to be used to determine whether a particular property should be tested for radon, but is used to assist various government agencies and organizations in focusing their radon program resources. Properties with high levels of radon have been found in all zones. Long-term (up to one year) measurement is generally recommended for the most accurate determination of radon levels. Radon testing is affordable and easily done. Test kits are available at the California Department of Public Health website at https://www.cdph.ca.gov/Programs/CEH/DRSEM/Pages/EMB/Radon/Radon-Testing.aspx.

The EPA recommends all structures should be tested for radon, regardless of geographic location or zone determination. If the radon level is greater than 4 picoCuries per Liter of air (pCi/L), the EPA suggests remediation. Additionally, the California Department of Conservation outlines Radon Zone areas where geologic conditions are likely to produce high, moderate, or low potential indoor radon levels above 4 pCi/L.
